

2016 ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE PROGRAMME "LET'S HELP THE VICTIMS OF 21.11"

On 21 November 2013, the collapse of the roof of a "Maxima" supermarket in Zolitude, Riga resulted in a tragedy, which is now recognised as one of the biggest technogenous disasters in Latvia's history. In order to collect donations to support the victims, the ABLV Charitable Foundation decided to launch a special programme "Let's Help the Victims of 21.11", whose objective is to provide long-term support to the children of families of victims of the Zolitude tragedy. The initial funding was obtained from the Christmas charitable campaign organised by the Foundation in 2013/2014, in which the Foundation invited not only ABLV Bank employees and clients to make donations, but also everyone else who wished to fulfil the objective of the "Let's Help the Victims of 21.11" programme.

To date, we have supported 8 youngsters with a total sum of EUR 25,699. The report on the results of our work is updated once every three months.
