



2015 ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE PROGRAMME "LET'S HELP THE VICTIMS OF 21.11"

On 21 November 2013 in Zolitude, Riga, the roof of a "Maxima" supermarket collapsed resulting in a tragedy that has been recognised as one of the biggest technogenous disasters in the history of Latvia. In order to collection donation for the support of the victims, ABLV Charitable Foundation decided to launch a special programme "Let's Help the Victims of 21.11" which main objective is to provide long-term support to children from families of victims of the tragedy. The initial financing was obtained from the Christmas Charitable Campaign organised by the Foundation in 2013/2014, in which ABLV Bank's employees and clients were invited to make donations, along with everyone else who wished to support the objective of the charitable project "Let's Help the Victims of 21.11".

With the help of the Foundation we continue to support two young people who in 2014 have started studies at the Latvian universities. The report on the results of our work is updated once every quarter.
